### **Australian Nursing Home Foundation Awarded 109 Home Care Packages**

Australian Nursing Home Foundation (ANHF) has received funding from the Australian Government Department of Social Services (formerly known as the Department of Health and Ageing ) for an extra 109 consumer-directed home care packages. ANHF will now provide the highest number of home care packages to the Chinese communities not only in NSW, but nationally. The funding results can be described as unprecedented, reflecting the importance the Government place in ensuring the welfare for the elderly Chinese in Australia. This is also an acknowledgement of ANHF's efforts and contribution to the Chinese community over the past 30 years.

The Australian Government is reforming the aged care service system nationally. The 'Living Longer Living Better' documents outlines the national plan to assist other people remain in their own homes for as long as possible and avoid premature admission to residential care.

Over the next 5 years, the government planned to spend an additional sum of \$800 million on the home care services thus increasing the existing quota to 100,000 community packages.

From August 2013, home care packages will be divided into 4 categories to replace the current 2-tier system. The Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT) will assess the care level based on the needs of the elderly. The four categories are:

Level I—Assist the elderly basic care needs.

Level 2—Low level of assistance to the elderly care needs similar to the current low level of car (CACP)

Level 3—Moderate level of assistance to provide for the elderly's care needs.

Level 4—High degree of care required to assist the elderly similar to the current high level of nursing services (EACH).

The new service will be implemented through the 'Consumer Directed Plan'. This approach will give more autonomy to the elderly and their carers in choosing the service types, service providers and service times. With the increase in home care funding from the Australian Government, ANHF will also be able to widen the distribution and scope of services. The extra packages will enable North Sydney to receive a quota of 42 packages; Sydney South East 40 packages; and Sydney's inner west 27 packages. This, together with the original quota of 91 packages will make a total of 200 home care packages under ANHF's care. This will enable the elderly Chinese to apply for ANHF's home care services, irrespective of their location.

Home care services include:

- Housekeeping: assisting in simple cleaning tasks such as vacuuming, washing floors.
- Personal Care: including showering and
- Meal preparation for the elderly such as: breakfast, lunch and dinner, and grocery
- Assisting in giving medication under strict conditions and where necessary, care workers will remind the elderly to take their medications.

The aim of the ANHF home care service is to provide the most appropriate service for the Chinese elderly to enable them to live securely and happily in their own homes for as long as possible.

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

## **Living Longer Living Better**

#### **Community Services News**

This is an exciting time for ANHF's Home Care Services. The Living Longer Living Better Aged Care Reform Package was announced on 20 April 2012. It involves a comprehensive 10-year plan to reshape aged care and build a better, fairer and more nationally consistent aged care system.

As part of the Living Longer Living Better Aged Care Reform in July this year, ANHF was awarded 109 Home Care Packages. It is highly significant for ANHF as we are the only Chinese organization in Australia to be awarded with such a high number of new home care packages. This means, we are able to service and benefit a wider Chinese and Vietnamese community.

There are changes to the current Community Care packages. They are now called Home Care Packages Level I, 2 3, & 4. These packages are offered based on the Consumer Directed Dare (CDC) principle to better care for the needs of the older person. Consumer Directed Care focuses on wellness and reablement, consumer choice and control, transparency and participation.

It is envisaged that all existing packages, CACP's, EACH and EACHD will be converted to CDC Home Care Packages by July 2015 at the latest.

In response and preparation for the additional 109 packages, the Home Care team have undertaken important measures to successfully implement these consumer directed care packages.

## A Dream Comes True

#### **Hurstville Respite Day Care Centre**

I still remember how exciting I was when I read the email from the Department of Health & Ageing announcing that the NRCP expansion funding was opened in October 2012. When I passed the news to our CEO, Ms Ada Cheng, she was even more excited and was determined to put in the funding application. It has always been her dream to set up a dementia day care service in the "Forget-Me-Not" wing of Lucy Chieng Aged Care Centre (LCACC) since its operation in 2011. The good news came in April 2013 that our application was successful. I expressed my interest to take up the position as day care co-ordinator and was fully supported by our CEO and ANHF Board. With the great assistance and co-operation from the administration office, Assets and Property Officer and most importantly from the Director of Nursing and staff at LCACC, the Hurstville Respite Day Centre began its operations on 4 June 2013.

A 14-seater bus pro-



vides transportation to service users within a 10km radius of the Centre. The primary objective is to provide respite care to the carers, family and friends of people living with dementia so as to relieve the stress of their caring role; to encourage the person with dementia to continue their activities of daily living in

the community for as long as possible. On the other hand, residents of LCACC are also welcomed to join in the day care activities and enjoy socialization with day care service users.

The service has proven to be successful to relieve the stress of the cares and enables them to take a break

from their caring role. They look forward to the day when their loved ones attend the day programs so that they can make good use of the time to meet with friends and pursue their interests. One of them told me that she was happy to return to the English class, the other one continues with her social dancing course. It is crucial for the carers to remain socially active, to get quality of life and maintain well-being.

Carers also noticed the changes happen to the person with dementia after attending day care centres. One of the carers said that although her mother cannot tell her what she has done in the Centre (due to poor short term memory), but she was always happy when she returned home and remained in good mood for the rest of the day, and often has a good night's sleep. Another carer said that her husband became more responsive and alert, showed interest in conversation and was more connected to the family members.

Looking after people with dementia is very challenging and requires great patience. Luckily, we have experienced staff and volunteers who are dedicated to serve the elderly in the day centre. With the joint efforts of staff, volunteers and family members, we can improve the quality of life of people with dementia, bringing colours to their lives.

# My Gift to You—Fond Memories

## An Interview with Mr Michael Lap Gin Tsang, Recreational Activity Officer at Chow Cho Poon Nursing Home

People say in Chow Cho Poon Nursing Home there is a time gallery much loved by everybody. Pinned up are heaps of old newspaper articles and posters that conjure up fond memories among people who are carried away in deep reminiscence. But...people have also been wondering how come CCPNH has such a huge collection of old newspapers and posters? Well, these are in fact the treasured collections of Mr Tsang.

As I stepped into the activity room on the interview day, my attention was naturally captured by Mr Tsang's slide show for the elderly residents on Hong Kong snapshots in the 60s. In response to my question why he has been collecting these old stuffs, Mr Tsang said, 'It's a habit of mine that has continued for decades. These are valuable historic records. Collecting them is like collecting our past ---- a once and for all thing that's very much worth doing.'

'My collection range is expansive: international news like the falling of the Berlin Wall, people leaving China in desperation during the large-scale starvation in the 60s; Hong Kong news like stringent water rationing (water supply available once per three days); capture of the notorious robber ZHANG Zi Qiang ---- even gossips about celebrities go under my collection items.'

'These old items stretched the storage space at my home. No matter how 'painfully unwilling' I felt, much had been discarded before migrating to Australia. Luckily back in 2004 I picked up the skills in saving them in the computer, so my days have been so busy but substantial in sorting them out every day after work.'

Before migrating to Australia Mr Tsang was a high school teacher. After coming to Sydney, he became the headmaster of a Chinese language school before taking up the position of Recreational Activity Officer at Chow Cho Poon Nursing Home. 'These were my former teaching aids but also very appropriate for elderly activities. Normally the centenarians in CCPNH

don't quite respond to things around them, yet their eyes will brim with tears on seeing these old photos. They readily recall the names of past celebrities on seeing them in these yellow-edged photos --- really amazing! Helping them to recall their memories and regain a strong hold of life is something very meaningful to me.

The day of the interview also marked Mr Tsang's last day of work before his retirement. 'Having worked in CCPNH for tens years I do miss the elderly residents. Every time I returned after the holidays they'd say how much they'd missed me and how longing there were for my telling them stories. I was so moved. After my retirement I'll visit them whenever I have time. These collections will be passed over to the new RAOs, in the hope of handing down such wonderful work.'



### 將美好回憶送給你---訪問周藻泮療養院康樂活動主任曾立展先生

聽說周藻泮療養院有個時間廊很受歡迎,裡面張貼著許多當年今日的報紙和海報,讓閱覽的人緬懷過去,勾起很多美好的回憶。一直很奇怪療養院哪裡來那麼多舊報紙和畫報,原來這都是康樂活動主任曾立展先生的珍藏。

訪問曾立展先生那天,剛好是他榮休前最後一天。「在周藻泮療養院工作了十年,我也很不捨得那些長者。每次我放假回來,他們都說很掛念我,很想聽我講故事,令我很感動。退休後我有空都會回來探望他們,也會將這些資料留給新的康樂活動主任,讓他們將這工作繼續承傳下去。」

我仍然記得在去年十月份得悉澳州政府健康 及老年事務部公報接受「全國照顧者暫息計 劃」資助申請時的興奮心情,當我告知行政 總裁鄭賜霞女士時,她比我更雀躍,並即時 决定申請撥款,因為當錢梁秀容療養院在 2011年落成後,她一直夢想著在專為腦退化 症患者而設的「無忘我」翼內開設日間中 心。今年四月份得知好消息,撥款申請已獲 批準,我便立刻表示有興趣做日間中心主任 之職位,並獲得行政總裁及董事局支持,在 各同事合作和努力下(特別是行政部、資產及 物業主任、錢梁秀容療養院院長和員工團 隊),好思維日間中心在六月四日正式展開服 務。



好思維日間中心服務時間為星期二、三、五 (公眾假期除外)上午九時至下午三時三十 分,為居住在中心十公里範圍內的長者提供 交通接送服務,目的是為腦退化症患者提供 日間中心活動以紓緩其家人/照顧者在長期照 顧患者所承受的壓力,協助患者維持日常自 我照顧能力和興趣,使患者可以和家人維持 在社區內生活,避免過早入住療養院。中心 亦歡迎療養院住客参與活動,與中心長者共 渡愉快時光。

中心提供的服務成功地幫助照顧者舒緩壓力,讓她/他們暫時離開照顧者的角色,她/他們都期待家人到中心活動的日子,這樣她/他們便能好好地利用時間與朋友相聚及重拾自己的興趣。其中一位照顧者高興地告訴我她可以参加英語課程,另一位則繼續她的社交舞班,照顧者保持社交活躍是非常重要,從而提高生活質素和維持身心健康。

照顧者亦留意到患有腦退化症的家人参與日間中心活動後的改變,有一位照顧者表示雖然媽媽(腦退化症患者)不能告訴她在中心做些甚麼(原因是她喪失短期記憶),但每次從中心回家她都很開心,這開心的情绪通常都維持到晚上,並能有一覺安睡。另一位照顧者則察覺到她的丈夫變得更有反應,投入家人的對話及與家人有更多的聯繫。

## 活得更長久,活得更精彩

對澳華療養院基金家居服務而言,這是令人振奮的時刻。自二零一二年四月二十日「活得更長久,活得更精彩」高齡服務改革方案正式公佈,這是個全面性的十年改革計劃,將重塑澳洲高齡服務成為一個更好、更公平、全國統一的高齡服務系統。作為「活得更長久,活得更精彩」高齡服務改革一份子,今年七月澳華療養院基金獲頒授109個家居服務配套名額。澳華療養院基金是全國唯一獲得最多家居服務配套名額的華人機構,這不單是對澳華療養院基金的高度認可,同時意味著將有更多華

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## 澳華療養院基金喜獲109個家居服務配套

澳華療養院基金獲澳洲政府社會服務事務 部(前健康及老年事務部)增加撥款,取得 109個家居服務配套。從政府官方網頁中可 見是次撥款結果,澳華療養院基金不單在 紐省,更是全國唯一獲得最多家居服務配 套的華人機構。這項公佈結果可謂前無古 人,創澳洲華人歷史先河,不但證明澳洲 政府非常重視澳洲華人長者的福祉,更是 對過去三十多年來澳華療養院基金在華人 社區的努力與貢獻作出特具意義的肯定。

澳洲政府現正進行高齡服務改革,新推出的「活得更長久,活得更精彩」(Living Longer Living Better)計劃正在全國全面展開。為了協助長者能在自己家裡安渡晚年,不用過早入住安老院,政府計劃在未來五年,耗資八億八千萬元,將家居服務由現有六萬個配額增至十萬個配額。

由二零一三年八月開始,家居服務配套將 分為四級制,以代替現行的二級制,由 「高齡護理評核組」按照長者不同的需要 以評定各自等級。四級制包括:第一級: 協助長者基本服務需要;第二級:協助長 者低度照顧需要,和現行的低度照顧服務 (CACP)類似;第三級:協助長者高度護理 驚要,和現行高度護理服務(EACH)類 似。新的家居服務將透過自選配套護理計 劃(Consumer Directed Care)推行。新的 計劃給與長者及照顧者有更多自主空間, 讓他們自由選擇服務類型、服務機構及服 務時間等。

是次澳華療養院基金家居服務成功獲得澳洲政府增加撥款,服務範圍包括悉尼北區

(42個配額)、悉尼東南區(40個配額) 及悉尼內西區(27個配額),連同原有在 各區的九十一個配額,現共有二百個家居 服務配額。無論長者居住在悉尼市任何一 個角落,都可以申請澳華療養院基金的家 居服務支援。家居服務範圍包括:一)家 居清潔:協助處理簡單清潔工作,如吸 塵、清洗地板。二)個人護理:包括協助 長者淋浴及整理儀容等。三)預備膳食: 可以為長者預備早午晚餐及買菜等。四) 交通接送:包括接送長者看醫生及購物 等。五)在符合藥物使用條例下監察及協 助使用藥物:若有需要,工作人員會提醒 長者按時服藥。
